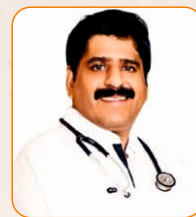

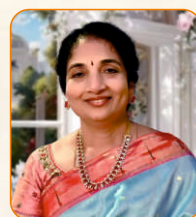

HOST CITY – KAKINADA

Kakinada (formerly called Kakinandi wada, listen is the sixth largest city of the Indian state of Andhra Pradesh and serves as the district headquarters of the Kakinada District. It lies on the coast of the Bay of Bengal. J.N.T.U. College of Engineering Kakinada, established in 1946, is the oldest and popular Government college in the state of Andhra Pradesh. The First Polytechnic college of Andhra Pradesh, Andhra Polytechnic was established here in 1946. It was also the origin point of Buckingham Canal where goods used to be transported by boats during the British rule. It was once home for Asia's largest sea port (now near the village Coringa).

Many people from the city migrated from this sea port to countries like Burma, Mauritius, Fiji and various southeast Asian countries to work there as workers where they were called as Coringas. Kakinada is also one of the fastest growing cities in Andhra Pradesh, and also a twin city of Pithapuram. Kakinada is known for its sweet called Kaja which became a

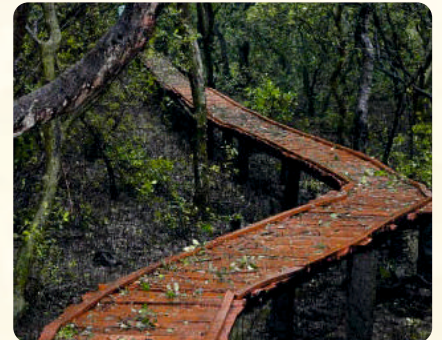
famous recipe in South India known as Kakinada Kaja. Apart from this, it is also known for food.



PLACES TO VISIT IN KAKINADA

Coringa Wildlife Sanctuary

Coringa Wildlife Sanctuary is an estuary situated near Kakinada in Andhra Pradesh, India. It is the third largest stretch of mangrove forests in India with 24 mangrove tree species and more than 120 bird species. It is home to the critically endangered white-backed vulture and the long-billed vulture. Mangroves are a group of trees and shrubs that live in the coastal intertidal zone, with a dense tangle of prop roots that make the trees appear to be standing on stilts above the water. This tangle of roots allows the trees to handle the daily rise and fall of tides; hence, the mangrove forest gets flooded at least twice per day.



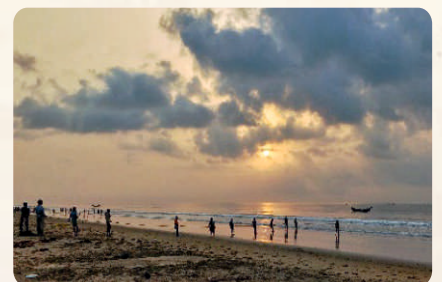
Hope Island

Hope Island is a small tadpole shaped Island situated off the coast of Kakinada, India, in the Bay of Bengal. Hope Island protects the city of Kakinada from the strong storm surges coming from the Bay of Bengal. The northern tip of the island is called "Godavari Point", which overlooks the entry point into the Kakinada Bay and the Kakinada harbour. Indian armed forces are using this island for beaching practice very often. Indian Navy landing craft War ships are conducting exercises for Marcos and special forces.



Kakinada Beach

Kakinada beach is a sea beach situated in a city Kakinada of Andhra Pradesh. This sea beach attracts a huge number of populaces for its presence of the temple of Koti Logeswaran Swami. Kakinada beach in Andhra Pradesh is 15 kilometres long by the sea side. The main economy of the people of Kakinada is fishing. Small huts can be seen alongside the beach. Small temple of Koti lingeswara swami and Kumbabishekam is situated in the town of Kakinada.



Sri Bhavannarayana Swamy Temple

The temple is located at a distance of 5 Km from Kakinada. The story of Sarpavaram is narrated in the Brahma Vyvarta Purana. The great saint Agastya narrated this story to Saunaka and other saints of the Nymisha forest. The great saint Kashyapa married Kadru, to whom thousand serpents were born. Kadru asked her sons to go and embrace to tall of Uchai Srava, the white horse of Lord Indra so that the she would make Vinata the second wife of her husband, her servant maid. But they disobeyed their mother as they did not like to dupe Vinata.



Adurru Excavation Site

Adurru is the location of an ancient Buddhist site, which is situated on a mound locally known as Dubaraju Gudi. The site was first excavated in 1925, and declared a protected monument by the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI) in 1955. Till 1960, people sacrificed animals at the mound during a two-day annual festival called Dubaraju Teertham, which was held on 13-14 January on the occasion of Sankranti. However, when the ruins were confirmed to be a former Buddhist site, the site was taken over by the ASI, and all sacrifices were banned.



VENUE INFORMATION

RANGARAYA MEDICAL COLLEGE

Rangaraya Medical College is a Government Medical College in Andhra Pradesh. It was established in 1958 and is in Kakinada, Andhra Pradesh, India. It is affiliated to Dr NTR University of Health Sciences. The Rangaraya Medical College was inaugurated on 17 November 1958 by Sri. Neelam Sanjeeva Reddy, then Chief Minister of Andhra Pradesh. One hundred students were admitted in the first year. Their teaching work for first MBBS was initiated on 15 August 1958 by Dr V. S. Krishna, vice chancellor of Andhra University. Dr Datla Satyanarayana Raju and Dr M. V. Krishna Rao founded and registered the Medical Education Society on 16 April 1958. Mullapudi Harishchandra Prasad of Sri Mullapudi Venkata Rayudu Memorial Educational Trust of Tanuku offered a donation of ₹5 lakh. The college was named after his late brother-in-law Sri. Pendyala Ranga Rao, zamindar of Dommeru. He became the vice president of the society. Sri Kotamarthi Venkanna gifted 6.5 acres of land, now called Kotamarthi Park on which stands the present men's hostels. Sri Draksharama Choultry Trust gave a donation of ₹50,000 towards construction of a lecture hall. Rao Venkata Kumara Mahipati Surya Rau, the Maharaja of Pithapuram, leased the palatial orphanage buildings (now the Main Campus) to house the Medical College. Two lecture halls and a dissection hall were constructed. The Government General Hospital would serve as the teaching hospital. The formal inauguration of the Rangaraya Medical College was done on 17 November 1958 by Sri. N. Sanjeeva Reddy, the then chief minister of Andhra Pradesh. Sports and cultural festivals were conducted involving colleges around the state, the most recent one being "NEXUS" conducted in 2010. Neonatology course was added by MCI in 2012 making it the first medical college in Andhra Pradesh and eighth in the India to provide D.M. Neonatology.
